


Off-campus Study Programs

FIRST Freshman Intercultural Relations Study Trip

The FIRST Program is an Off-campus Study Program for first-year students. It's also the most popular Off-campus Study Program at APU. Without a doubt, the most defining characteristic of the program is its spirit of adventure. As soon as students arrive at a program site, they draw straws to select local destinations, which can even include small cities not normally visited by tourists. Being unfamiliar with the local language, students must rely on their own abilities to make their way to the destination and administer a questionnaire to over two hundred people. Students from the same language basis are put together in small groups, where they work on their communication skills and understanding of different cultures and acquire the skills for making the most of their life on APU's multicultural campus.

Introduction to Research: Achieve your goals in foreign countries while working in both Japanese and English SECOND SElf CONfirmation and Development program

Southeast Asia is a region of diverse languages, religions, and cultures. In the SECOND Program, first to third semester students deepen their understanding of cultural diversity by traversing four Southeast Asian countries and conducting a survey along the way. Participants are divided into small groups composed of both domestic and international students and are expected to use both Japanese and English throughout the program. One major advantage of this program is that even first to third semester students who are not yet comfortable with their language ability can study together without fear of making mistakes. If you are interested in learning the fundamentals of field research and performing high-level multicultural collaborative learning, then this program is for you.

By participating in this program in Thailand, you can learn more about how this gap came about, and how we can begin to eliminate it.

Japanese UMakunaru Program

The JUMP is for students who want to improve their Japanese ability in a short period of time. Students take the Standard Course or Advanced Course depending on their Japanese level. In both courses, students walk around Beppu and meet with residents of the community. Students then propose ideas to the local government to promote local tourism and revitalize the community. In addition to acquiring the Japanese needed for information gathering, analysis, and proposal writing, students implement the ideas they presented to the local government and contribute to the community as part of the program. Language Immersion Program

Held at foreign universities or affiliated language schools during summer or spring breaks, the Language Immersion Program is an intensive language learning program aimed at boosting students' language abilities. Students gain practical language skills and learn about the host country's culture and customs by immersing themselves in a foreign environment, interacting with local populations, and participating in activities that develop their intercultural adaptability. In order to take full advantage of educational opportunities in the host country, programs combine pre- and post-program lectures, with the latter helping students reflect on their learning in the host country and link it to their future studies at APU.

If you are interested in Thailand or have included Thailand in your future plans, the Thai Immersion Program will definitely give you a better understanding of "Thainess" and bring you one step closer to your goals.

Head into the field with APU faculty **Field Study / Field Research Project**

This program enables students to carry out field work and research in a specialized field of each college under the guidance of a faculty member, deepens students' interest in their chosen field, and serves as a bridge between theory and practice.

Students in the College of Asia Pacific Studies will develop a strong interest in specialized study. First-year students take part in a program focused on the four fields of "Environment and Development," "International Relations," "Tourism and Hospitality," and "Culture, Society and Media." Second-year students and above complete specialized research in each field. For students in the College of International Management, this program grants a business perspective against the backdrop of multinational corporations and focuses on social entrepreneurs practicing social change. These programs provide field experience, deepen theme-related knowledge through pre- and post-program classes, and foster knowledge and skills.

In this program, we provide those who are interested in working in international organizations with opportunities to visit organizations such as the United Nations and get firsthand insight from staff on the ground. Through this program, you will become more familiar with international organizations and start thinking about them as viable career options.



SOLVE (SOciaL innoVation and Entrepreneurship) The Philippines ALCANTARA Lailani L. Professor (APM) Program Coordinate

SOLVE is an experiential and field training program that teaches students how to put business concepts into practice through social innovation and social enterprises. One of the program sites, the Philippines, is a notable member of the ASEAN countries with a very high rate of economic and population growth. During the program, students take part in a hands-on activity sponsored by local

organizations dedicated to training social entrepreneurs. This activity brings together students, social entrepreneurs, and local people to teach how businesses can make an impact on society. Students are divided into groups and search for business-oriented solutions to a wide range of issues, including poverty, unemployment, hunger, food access, and quality of education.

Independently design and implement a research project in the real world **APU Global Research Program**

Through this program, students will acquire research skills related to their interests in each APS area of study. By requiring students to develop research questions related to specific issues, this program grants students the skills to gather relevant information and make proper preparations for conducting research. In the practicum, students take a hands-on approach based on their research plan at each program site and compile their results into a report.

Serve as Japanese language and culture ambassadors in Southeast Asia "NIHONGO Partners" Program



Additionally, the 8-month program includes close interaction with the local community to deepen students' understanding of the local language and culture, with the goal of building bridges of friendship between Japan and the countries of the ASEAN region.

Study at Ritsumeikan University as an exchange student **Domestic Exchange Program**

In the Domestic Exchange Program, a select number of students study for six months or a full year as exchange students at Ritsumeikan University (Kyoto City, Kyoto Prefecture; Kusatsu City, Shiga Prefecture; Ibaraki City, Osaka Prefecture).

Credits earned while on this program can be transferred back to APU upon the students' return. Based on the Student Exchange agreement, students pay tuition to APU during the program, and are exempt from paying tuition to Ritsumeikan University.

In addition to the six-month and year-long programs, Ritsumeikan University also offers a course during summer break. Credits earned on this program can be transferred back to APU.

International Exchange Program

The International Exchange Program sends students overseas to study at a partner university for six months or one year. At their host university, students primarily take regular curriculum courses to complement their specialization. Students continue to pay APU tuition fees without paying additional tuition fees to their host university. Students begin their exchange one year after submitting an application. Classes conducted in English are also available at partner universities in non-English-speaking countries.

Why I Decided to Go Abroad

I decided to go on exchange to the U.K. for two reasons. Firstly, I wanted to deepen my knowledge of International Business, which I have been studying in the multicultural context of APU. Secondly, I wanted to put my multicultural understanding to the test in a culture very different from my own, without being able to lean on family or friends for support. At my host university, most classes centered on discussions and assignments, including essays. Rather than simply taking in information, we were encouraged to truly process class content within ourselves and in relation to our own opinions. As a result, I became aware of similarities and differences between local students and myself. Compared to APU, there were more students from Europe, Africa, and the

Get advice about your international exchange concerns



Going on exchange requires putting together a comprehensive study plan that includes more than simply advanced English skills. At APU, students aiming to study overseas can get support from older students who have returned from overseas programs. Known as SEAs (Student Exchange Advisors), these students provide support based on their exchange experience, giving advice on how to prepare for an international exchange program and create a goal-oriented learning plan, as well as on life at the host university, post-exchange plans, and more. The SEAs have their own booth in the Academic Office where students can receive advice on a variety of exchange-related questions and concerns.

Middle East. Our different backgrounds sometimes led to arguments or differences of opinion in class, activities, and our dorm life. However, overcoming these challenges allowed me to gain new perspectives to apply in my daily life.

By believing in myself to step outside of the familiar APU environment and study together with students from many different backgrounds, I was able to look objectively at both my past learning at APU and my own growth. At the same time, I realized that I have only seen a small slice of the world. The process of deepening my learning through a one-year exchange allowed me to appreciate the value of placing myself in a diverse environment. Going on exchange has also shaped my decision to work in an international company after graduation, one where I can continue my exposure to different backgrounds.

Ample Support for a Meaningful Exchange Experience

Because I was going on exchange in the second semester of my third year, I had some concerns related to study plan, job hunting, and so on. However, APU provided constant support before departure and up until the end of the program. Thanks to this level of support, I didn't need to feel anxious while taking on many challenges, such as my studies, internships, travel, and job hunting.


